CALL TO ORDER- The Village of Rushville Council was call into Regular Session by Mayor Paul Norby at the Town Hall.

VISITORS-

Bill Myers- Village of Rushville Maintenance Department

Mike Tipple and Jeremy Anderson- Oak Leaf Lane- Asking Rushville to take action in taking over the street and take care of the street. Paul said that we have a Solicitor to keep us clean and out of trouble. His opinion is that Jeff was asked to do something, which he didn't do, and now he appears to be moving on. Mike said that Jeff has finally closed on the last house and that was the only hope for the other homeowners that he would finish the street. Steve said that their frustration is heard. The problem is that we have the same frustration that we can't just jump in and help you right now. It's not that we don't want to do the leaf pick up and snow plowing. If we take our truck down there to pick up leaves or plow snow, we have no liability coverage. We do have coverage for the sewer and water systems because we own them. Jeff may not be totally off the hook. He may have some challenges with the Fairfield County Engineers because he didn't do some things that he was supposed to do. There are a whole lot of things going on right now, but we aren't going to be able to tell you anything tonight. Mike asked if there could be a class action lawsuit. Jon said that a group could go together to sue Jeff, but it wouldn't be a class action lawsuit. Steve repeated that this is a lot going on behind the scenes and that Jenny has had a lot of conversations with the engineer's office. Jon said that at the end of the day, at this point, it's just a big, wide driveway. The State of Ohio and the Engineers set standards, and this road wasn't built to those standards as he understands it. It will fall apart sooner than it should. Mike asked about having an actual engineer come out and survey the road. Lillian said that that is what Council requested that Jeff do, and he hasn't. Steve said that all of you could go together and hire and engineer to come out and see what's there. Mike asked if they did that, and the engineer certified that the road was good, would that be enough. Steve said that was all we were asking from Jeff. John said also that the turn around would also have to be completed. John also said that there was supposed to be 7" of hard pack and 7" of concrete. When Columbia Gas did the bore for

the new line, there was only 5 ½" of concrete. Mike made a public records request for the correspondence with Jeff. Cindy said she would get copies of everything in the file to him. Jon asked how many families are involved. Mike said there are seven. Jon said that if the seven put in a hundred dollars apiece to hire a lawyer, it would go a long way toward some guidance.
